This time, patients smiled when I asked how they felt about getting care at the clinic. The new presentation was finished in two weeks! A generous gift provided for this purchase.

The recent Haitian elections were fairly calm, and there was a clear winner for president.

**Projects** A pavilion for patients was added to the project list at the end of this past summer. That structure has just been completed and is probably already in use. The patients now have somewhere besides my porch to go at 5:30 in the morning.

**Prayer** I will be returning to Haiti on January 12, our Lord willing. The date marks the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my first arrival in Haiti for medical mission service. Please pray for wisdom during preparation and travel, and for a ministry that will bring glory to God in the coming year.

Jesus—Emmanuel—the eternal God Who arrived in Bethlehem as a baby. This is a mystery God has revealed but is beyond our comprehension. May we offer humble adoration and praise to the Word Who became one of us.
